Bless those who work on the seas: sailors, fisher folk, lifeboat crews, and those who live by the seasons.

God of the harvest:

God of the skies, forgive our greed and pollution, our desire for the quick delivery of our food, and our wastefulness.

Bless those who work in our skies: pilots and air crews. Bless our Fairtrade partners and those who live and work by the seasons.

Creator God, reconnect us to your creation, to its order and resources.

Redeemer God, reconcile us to your creation, to its order and resources.

Spirit God, renew us to live within your creation, aware of its seasons and our neighbours' needs.

God of the land, God of the seas, God of the skies, bless us and make us a blessing to those in need within your created order.

And now hear us as we pray further in the words Jesus taught his disciples, saying:

Read: Revelation 5 verses 11 - 14

John 21 verses 1 - 14

Reflection

You might chose to concentrate on the Gospel passage of the miraculous catch of fish or think about the wider idea of a harvest of the sea. This part of the service might involve music or something visual; it might involve silence.
