Matthew 13 verses 31 - 33

I chose one part of the Book of Ruth, but you might choose a different part of the story. You might concentrate on the theme of Harvest or on another part of the story with Harvest as the backdrop. This part of the service might involve music or something visual; it might involve silence.

Prayer
