Harvest Thanksgiving has a different emphasis in different areas. In rural areas there is still a traditional emphasis to the festival and it still sometimes the famers who determine when Harvest Thanksgiving should take place.

This week could provide an opportunity to think about places where there can be no celebration because there is no harvest.

This part of the service might involve music or something visual; it might involve silence.
