Read: Acts 2 verses 1 - 11

John 20 verses 19 - 23

Reflection

Suggestions for a short reflection:

Many people feel less comfortable speaking about the Holy Spirit than about God the Father or about Jesus? Why might that be? How do you imagine the Holy Spirit and what part does the Spirit play in your Christian life and witness?

These are only suggestions. You will have lots of other ideas.

This part of the service might involve music or something visual; it might involve silence. You might choose to use this reflection:

Who is this Holy Spirit?
Sounds a bit spooky to me!
Weren't those weird old prophets meant to be spiritfilled?

What a lot of strange things they did! And what about King David dancing before the Lord and all that?

His wife was appalled.

Then at Pentecost some odd things happened: "Speaking in tongues" and everyone hearing in their own language – little wonder people thought the disciples were drunk!

No, you'll not catch me having anything to do with the Holy Spirit.

I mean, Christianity is meant to be safe and sensible, isn't it?

Who needs the Holy Spirit?
