Read: Psalm 24

Prayer

Loving God,

In this season of excitement and weariness open our hearts to your presence. We know that you meet us and hold us:

in and beyond the busyness

in and beyond the glitter

in and beyond the rush.

When we are tired and frayed, when we lose sight of what it's all about, when we put ourselves first, and forget that you come to bring love, come close and restore us and forgive us, we pray.

Hear us as we pray in your Son's words, saying:

OUR FATHER

As with madness (this can be sung to As with Gladness)

As with madness we prepare For this festive time of year, As we rush and count the days, Advent passes in a haze, So may our feet take us to Places where we will meet you.

As with madness we collapse In our armchairs to have naps, As we eat too much and then Fill our plates right up again, So may we enjoy this feast, Prompted now to share at least. As with madness we keep on Trying to ignore your Son, Timely God now takes a risk, Bawling babe now shakes a fist, So may each of us now see Christ has come to set us free.

Read: Luke 1 verses 26 - 38

Reflection –

This should take the form of an introduction from the leader of 5 - 7 minutes **maximum**, and designed to stimulate discussion on the subject.

Today's discussion might be about:

The ways in which our preparation for Christmas might be different this year.

As Church people, are we just as guilty as everyone else of putting other aspects of Christmas before Jesus? **OR** it might be about the Gospel passage. The choice is the leader's!

This part of the service might involve music or something visual; it might involve silence

Prayer

This a time for prayers for the world; for the communities in which we live; for the Church in our land and for our own congregations of Dalmeny and

Queensferry; for those known to us to be in particular need of our prayers; for ourselves.
